June is PTSD (Post Traumatic Stress Disorder) Awareness Month.

Post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) is an anxiety disorder caused by very stressful, frightening or distressing events and occurs following the experience or witnessing of a traumatic event. A traumatic event is a life-threatening event such as military combat, natural disasters, terrorist incidents, serious accidents, or physical or sexual assault in adult or childhood, mugging or robbery.

Take the mystery out of PTSD: learn what it is, who is affected, and how treatment can help.

No matter how much you know about PTSD, there is always more to learn –new research, treatment methods, and educational resources.
