Target Updates

Disaster Relief

Target V and Target III collaborated on the "Buckets of Hope for Haiti" initiative to ensure that communities in Haiti have usable household supplies for daily living. Thirty five-gallon plastic buckets were filled with toothpaste, toothbrushes, soap, face cloths, antibiotic ointment, sanitary napkins, crayons, children's books, canned meat, and water and shipped to the earthquake devastated country. Additionally, Target V purchased and donated non-perishable items to help those recovering from the effects of Hurricane Maria in Puerto Rico.



Model UNA-USA

Target V engages the ASCEND students through Model UN mini-simulation activities. The students completed a two-part unit of the Model UN classroom on Human Rights of Refugees in Syria. Part 1 involved the students discussion of the refugee crisis. Part 2 involved the students writing resolutions that would address solving the international crisis. Three of the students presented their resolutions, and received gift cards for completing the project.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (November 28, 2017), "heart disease is the leading cause of death for both men and women. About 610,000 people die of heart disease in the United States every year; that is 1 in every 4 deaths. Heart disease is the leading cause of death for people of most ethnicities in the United States, including African Americans, Hispanics, and Caucasians. For American Indians or Alaska Natives and Asians or Pacific Islanders, heart disease is second only to cancer. In 2008, approximately 24% of deaths in African Americans were caused by heart disease."
